Founded in 1766, Rutgers is one of only nine colonial colleges established before the American Revolution.

Rutgers is one of 62 schools in the prestigious Association of American Universities, whose members are North America's leading research universities.

Rutgers is a top 30 public national university in *U.S. News & World Report* rankings.

Rutgers is New Jersey's land-grant university, in the company of such schools as Cornell, MIT, and the University of Wisconsin–Madison.

Rutgers is a member of the Big Ten Academic Alliance, an academic consortium of 14 top-tier American research universities.
